TRUSTEE DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

SUMMARY

The Board of Trustees of the Lakewood Public Library consists of seven members appointed by The Lakewood City Schools Board of Education. Trustees serve for a seven-year term and may stand for reappointment to subsequent terms. The Board of Trustees establishes policies and long-term goals for the library; oversees the general operation of the library; initiates and oversees the budget process; promotes and advocates for the library in the community; and hires, sets salary for and evaluates the performance of the library director and fiscal officer.

DUTIES & RESPONSIBILITIES

- Attend regularly scheduled and special meetings of the Board. Regular meetings of the Board are scheduled for the second Thursday of each month
- Serve on standing committees of the Board as assigned by the Board president
- Work with the Board to establish the annual budget, approve expenditure of funds and monitor the Library's financial performance throughout the year
- Maintain a working knowledge of Ohio library funding including,
 - o Operation of the Public Library Fund ("PLF"), including allocation of funds among the County library systems
 - o Local property taxes
 - o The annual library budgeting process
- Hire and supervise the Library Director and Clerk-Treasurer to implement Board decisions and directions and to carry out day-to-day provision of Library services
- Maintain a working knowledge of local, state and federal laws impacting operation of the library; actively support library legislation at the state and federal level
- Determine and adopt written policies to govern the operation and services of the Library
- Establish short and long-term goals for the Library through the strategic planning process

- Act as a liaison with the public, interpreting and informing local government, the media and public of library services and needs
- Maintain an awareness of emerging library issues and trends and understand the implications for library users
- Represent the interests and needs of community members
